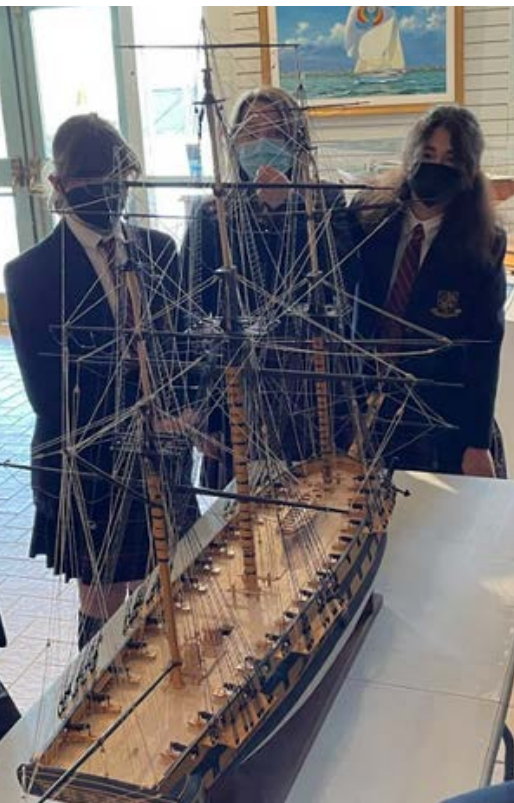
GRADE 11 CHEMISTRY

In Mr. Streight's Grade 11 Chemistry class, students performed their first titration of a strong acid with a strong base. Titration is the slow addition of one solution of a known concentration (called a titrant) to a known volume of another solution of unknown concentration until the reaction reaches neutralization (often indicated by a colour change). In this case, the colour change was pink. The titrant must satisfy the necessary requirements to be a primary or secondary standard. In a broad sense, titration is a technique to determine the concentration of an unknown solution.

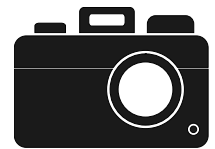
