Esther Isadora Falkson

Esther came to Leahurst College in September 2014 and graduated in 2019. She is currently attending The University of Toronto, majoring in Environmental Geography with a double minor in GeoScience and Ecology.

We caught up with Esther and decided to ask her a few questions about what has been going on since she graduated from Leahurst College.

Q. What lessons did you take from your 5 years here at Leahurst College.

A. Leahurst taught me to make connections with my teachers/professors - they are people too! When you take the time to communicate, they tend to be helpful and compassionate. Tutorials prepared me to take advantage of office hours (my GPA's #1 saving grace).

Q. Did you have any favourite classes at Leahurst?

A. Choosing a single class as my favourite is very difficult, but for now, I'll say "Challenge and Change in Society".

Q. How did Leahurst help you prepare for what you are doing now?

A. My time at Leahurst gave me a strong academic foundation (particularly in physics), but more than that I think it really gave me an opportunity to try new things (like climbing and rowing), take initiative, and take on leadership roles in a comfortable environment. These experiences gave me much-needed confidence before entering the big sea of U of T (60,000+ students).

Q. Are you still in touch with other Leahurst students?

A. I'm in touch with some Leahurst graduates for sure! But, if any current students have any questions for me, they are welcome to reach out.

Q. What are you working on now?

A. I was recently appointed as a research assistant looking at clean, freshwater access (mostly in Canada) and sustainability policy recommendations. Aside from that, I am also in the midst of applying for a grant to do my own geophysical research on wetland restoration (basically I plan to look at dirt and rocks near wetlands using very expensive machines).
