Schulich Leader Scholarship – Engineering

A top-tier Canadian STEM entrance award, the Schulich Leader Scholarship offers \$120,000 (in annual \$30,000 payments over four years) to entrepreneurial-minded high school or CÉGEP graduates entering engineering at one of 20 partner universities.

Eligible students must be Canadian citizens, demonstrate academic excellence, an entrepreneurial mindset (leadership, creativity), and preferably financial need, and plan a career in engineering, technology, entrepreneurship, or applied research. Schools nominate top candidates, with selection taking place at the university level early in the admission cycle. Winning not only provides major financial support and prestige but also connects recipients to a national network of innovators and mentorship opportunities.


