Our Grade 9s went Rock Climbing at the Boiler Room. Obviously, no one is afraid of heights!










ENRICHMENT DAY

Congratulations to Tessa (Gallus gallus domesticus) and to Kjell (baby lamb). Cuteness and talent all around!


DID YOU KNOW...

- Gallus gallus domesticus or Gallus domesticus (aka chickens) are the most common domestic animals worldwide.
- The early 21st century mitochondrial DNA data suggest that various red junglefowl (Gallus gallus) subspecies are the wild ancestors of the domestic chicken. However, more recent genomic data reveals that Gallus gallus spadiceus, indigenous to northern Thailand, Myanmar, and southwestern China, is its main wild ancestor.
- Hens can lay up to 300 eggs per year

Guess which of these book covers were designed by our students? Trick question: they all were.


